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Ranhill welcomes US Ambassador to its clean energy power plant in Sabah

Ranhill Holdings Berhad (“**Ranhill**”) welcomed the visit of the new US Ambassador to Malaysia, Her Excellency Kamala Lakshmi, to its power plant in Sabah, today. Ranhill owns and operates 2 combined cycle power plants, each rated at 190 MW in Sabah, contributing 380 MW electricity-generating capacity and electricity production for 21 years.

“The Combined Cycle Gas Turbines (CCGT) uses both a gas and a steam turbine together to produce up to 50 percent more electricity from the same fuel than a traditional simple-cycle plant”, said Dr. Zahrul Faizi, Chief Executive Officer of Ranhill Power Division. “This enables us to reduce our carbon footprint and produce clean energy for Sabah”, he added.

Ranhill has more than 15 years of operational expertise in producing clean energy and is the primary independent power producer in Sabah. It is contributing about 37% of the maximum load demand to the State and has consistently improved its plant reliability performance to surpass the industry average in the past few years.

Ranhill CCGT Power Plants are located at Kota Kinabalu Industrial Park, Sabah.

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Ranhill Holdings Berhad (“Ranhill”) is a Malaysian conglomerate listed on the Main Market of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad and has invested extensively in environment and power sectors. In the environment sector, it provides water supply services, operates water and wastewater treatment plants, and provides specialized services in the management and optimization of water utility assets. In the power sector, it owns and operates two 190 MW plants in Sabah, Ranhill Power I (RPI) and Ranhill Power II (RPII), providing up to 380 MW of electricity-generating capacity and electricity production for 21 years. Routine maintenance on both power plants is done by Ranhill Power O&M Sdn Bhd (RPOM) and Ranhill Power O&M II Sdn Bhd (RPOMII), the subsidiaries of RPI and RPII respectively. Its operations and services are primarily in Malaysia and its international operations are centered in Asian markets such as China, Thailand and South East Asia.

In the environment business, it has been granted an exclusive license (renewable every three years) by the Minister of Energy, Green Technology and Water, Malaysia to provide source-to-tap water supply services with total capacity of 1,986 MLD (million liters per day) to the end-customers in the entire State of Johor. Outside Malaysia, it operates water concession assets on a BOT and TOT basis through its subsidiary, Ranhill Water Technologies (Cayman) Ltd, in China with total capacity of 260 MLD and in Thailand with total capacity of 102 MLD, including a 10 MLD reclaimed water treatment plant.
